Mattress RECYCLING



- 1. When you purchase a new mattress, ask the local mattress store to recycle your old one; or
- 2. For home pick-up of an old mattress, without the purchase of a new one, contact a hauler that will recycle your mattress; or
- 3. Take your mattress to the Residential Drop-off area at the County Landfill for a fee or contact 7 Rivers Recycling at 608-783-6727, ext. 103 to find other drop-off locations.

Residential Drop-off Area: \$5 min. or a \$120/ton tipping fee (car, truck, mini van, SUV)

- **Garbage** (normal household waste)
- Large Items (furniture, toys, bikes, stoves, grills, washers, dryers)
- **Demolition/Constuction** (wood, drywall, flooring, roofing, doors, windows, etc.)

Processing Pad: \$5 min. or a per ton tipping fee

Landfill: \$15 service charge and \$64/ton tipping fee (trailer, cargo van, U-Haul type, business vehicles including landlords)

(refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, de-humidifier)

Microwaves: \$10 each

- 2.95% on \$78.01 or more


Only people authorized by site attendants may utilize the landfill facility. You must provide your own labor for unloading materials. Due to safety concerns, we do not permit salvaging once waste is placed into containers.

PLEASE READ SIGNAGE

The Landfill's address is 3240 Berlin Drive. The diagram to the right illustrates the entrance to our facility (the landfill is the second right on Berlin Drive). The landfill entrance is equipped with inbound and outbound scales – all landfill customers must scale in and out. Department staff are available at the scale to direct you on disposal options and collection of payment.

For mailing, billing, and other departmental questions our office is located at 3200 Berlin Drive (first right on Berlin Drive) and parking is available on the south side of the building. We can also be reached at (608) 785-9572.

PLEASE NOTE:

- You must have a recycling card to use the Drop-Off site. To obtain a card, contact the Town Clerk or attendant.
- The Site is for the use of Town of Burns residents/ taxpayers ONLY—not relatives or friends from outside the township. Do not risk losing your disposal privileges.
- If rules are not followed, citations will be issued according to the Recycling Code.

Yard Waste

Currently the town has no program for yard wastes and suggests that you compost your leaves and grass clippings on your property.

Recycling Fees and Instructions

- FREE recycling of some items is offered: Newspapers, glass jars and bottles, steel and aluminum cans, number #1, #2, (bottle form only) and #5 plastics, cardboard (no clam-shell to-go containers), paper cartons and newspapers are accepted. NEW BEVERAGE PAPER CUPS. NO BAGGED ITEMS ARE ALLOWED empty all bags into the bin. NO SHREDDED PAPER, even if bagged. See "How to Prepare Recyclables" page 3. Scrap metal items of a reasonable size are also accepted. Place demolition in the respective metal bin or large item dumpster/container.
- **Used tires:** Fee is \$7 for car/truck tires; \$20 for semi/tractor tires. Tires must be removed from rims prior to being accepted. Tires may also be recycled at La Crosse County's Household Hazardous Waste facility. See outside of brochure for more information.
- Other materials: The Town accepts small quantities of private demolition materials, furniture, carpeting, silo bags and other household items only until that Dumpster is full. (If it is full when you get there, please wait until the next Saturday.) Household appliances and electronic devices (E-waste) are accepted for recycling any time the solid waste recycling area is open. Fees are assessed for some of these items.

Special note on appliances: See light-green box in right column regarding appliance (white goods) disposal.

Special note on electronic devices: See blue box in the right column. See also the outside of this brochure for information on recycling these devices at La Crosse County's Household Hazardous Materials facility.

Mattress/Boxspring: Fee \$20

Hazardous materials: Cleaners, solvents, gasoline, oil, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials may not be placed in the regular trash. Refer to the front page to see which hazardous materials are accepted at the La Crosse County Household Hazardous Materials Site. If in question, call the facility for a recommendation at 608-785-9999.

Special note on oil filters: By law they must be recycled. Take to the Household Hazardous Materials Facility (see box at right).

Light bulbs, dishes, glasses, mirrors, ceramics, jar covers, foil packaging are to be put into your regular garbage.

Open Burning

• Burning barrels and brush piles: No permit is required for burning barrels or brush piles. Before and when finished burning brush, call the La Crosse County Dispatch at 608-785-9634 and the Fire Chief at 606-498-8902

- Burning other clean materials: A permit is required to burn clean materials (except brush). Burning permits can be obtained from the Chairman, the Supervisors or the Fire Chief (606-498-8902).
- Campfire rings: The fire must be contained in a manufactured freestanding fire pit, or ring placed at a safe distance from any structure or combustibles. Fire pits dug into the ground should be lined on the ouside with gravel, brick, concrete, or rock to prevent the spread of flames across the ground.


Town of Burns Recycling & Solid Waste Drop-Off Site 2022 Schedule

The Town of Burns Drop-Off Site is for Town of Burns residents **ONLY**. You must have a garbage/recycling card (obtainable from the Town Clerk) to use the site. The site is for:

- Household garbage
- Recycling materials: Glass, steel and aluminum cans, #1, #2, #4 and #5 plastics, cardboard, paper cartons, and newspapers. See "How to Prepare Recyclables" below. Please do not dispose of recyclables in regular household garbage.
- Appliances (see fees on page 2)
- E-waste (see fees on page 2) Note: Wisconsin law now REQUIRES recycling of electronic waste. It may not be disposed of in your household garbage.
- Tires (see fees on page 2)
- Oil filters and other materials (see page 2)

Paper and Cardboard: Newspapers, magazines, cereal, soda and beer boxes, paperback books, phone books, paper bags, mail/junk mail. Cardboard boxes must be broken down.

Non-Acceptable Materials for Recycling - Plastic bags, kitchen garbage bags, car/specialty batteries, photographs, styrofoam, regular trash, yard waste, specialty bulbs (small incandescent/LED can go in trash), dishes, ceramic, mirrors, wood or demolition materials, computer/larger electronics, large carpet rolls, full aerosol cans and wet paint containers, (empties can go in regular trash).

Household Hazardous Materials Facility (HHM)

Free for La Crosse County, WI Residential Users (unless otherwise noted below)
Houston County, MN and surrounding Counties (Fees apply).

Acceptable Materials

- Automotive fluids
- Batteries (rechargeable, lead acid, lithium)
- Cell phones and digital cameras
- Cleaning products
- Computers (desktops, laptops, tablets)
- Computer peripherals (fax machines, hard drives, keyboards, mice, printers, scanners, speakers)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Lawn and garden chemicals
- Medications (non-controlled only)
- Mercury-containing devices (barometers, thermometers, thermostats, etc.)
- Microwaves and small Freon appliances Fees Apply
- Paints, stains, varnish and solvents
- Pool chemicals
- Propane cylinders (handheld only)
- Sharps and needles
- TVs and computer monitors Fees Apply
- Video devices (cable and satellite receivers, DVD players, gaming consoles, VCRs, etc.)

Non-Acceptable Materials

- Compressed gas cylinders (other than propane)
- Controlled substance medications
- Explosives (inc. black powder, fireworks and military munitions)
- Shock sensitive materials (picric acid, etc.)
- Radioactive materials (inc. smoke detectors)

SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP!

These items can and should go into your regular curbside trash or recycling:

- Alkaline batteries (trash)
- Dried out paint (trash)
- Empty paint and aerosol cans (recycle)
- Fertilizer without pesticide (trash)
- Ice melt and rock salt (trash)
- Incandescent light bulbs (trash)

Preparation & Transportation

Residential Dropoff Hours

Monday - Friday (year-round) 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. 1st & 3rd Saturdays (April - October only) 9:00 a.m. - Noon

Businesses and organizations by appointment only

Residential users with more than 200 lbs of material are encouraged to schedule an appointment.

Out-of-County residents are welcome to use the program on a fee basis.

FREE PRODUCT REUSE ROOM!

Over 80,000 pounds of useable household products are sorted and made available to the public in our Reuse Room annually. All items are free, but donations are appreciated. The Reuse Room is open Monday – Friday from 8 AM to 4 PM. The Reuse Room is located on the east side of the landfill office building, directly adjacent to the HHM Facility.

Safe Transportation of Hazardous Materials

- 1. Never mix chemicals.
- 2. Bring items in original containers or clearly mark contents. Tell facility technician if you are unsure what is in a container.
- 3. Tighten all covers and lids.
- **4.** If a container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak-proof pail or tub.
- **5.** Avoid spills. Place waste containers upright and place securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van. Do not transport waste containers in vehicle passenger areas.
- **6.** Gasoline should be transported in a designated red safety container.



- 7. Motor oil should be transported in a durable and leak-proof container labeled with the words "Used Oil."
- **8.** Tape the terminal ends of batteries with clear tape to prevent arcing. Do not co-mingle batteries with chemicals.
- **9.** Transport fluorescent bulbs securely to avoid breakage. Do not tape bulbs together.
- **10.** Upon arrival, pull under the HHM canopy and remain in your vehicle with the engine shut off.



- Needles, syringes, auto-injectors (EpiPens) and lancets must be transported in sealed, puncture-resistant containers.
- Container options include a standard red sharps container or a thick plastic laundry detergent bottle with screw on cap. All containers must be labeled with the word "SHARPS."
- Additional sharps collection sites can be found on the Alliance to HEAL website.
